keep raising the matter with the Egyptian president. We also asked people to take the 'postcards' with Alaa and his son pictured, and to post them off for Father's Day, to the Prime Minister and some 15 of these were taken with the senders messages for Alaa on the reverse.

"A letter to the Israeli prime Minister regarding house demolitions and illegal settlements was also signed and sent.

"On a very warm day, (a change here as it has been very cool!) we also raised £111 for Amnesty. Another member, Jane, added another £90 from garden gate sales of plants and seeds, all of which came from her garden. This is an ongoing project by Jane and she has raised a lot of money over the last couple of years in this way both at the garden gate and at other events."

Thanks to the North Norfolk Group for their efforts and for illustrating how fundraising can work well alongside campaigning activities helping fund the work you're encouraging the public to support.
