# Virginia Laparra Guatemala

# **EX-PROSECUTOR UNJUSTLY JAILED**



Former prosecutor Virginia Laparra has been unjustly imprisoned for the last nine months because of her work investigating corruption cases. Amnesty considers her a prisoner of conscience.

The former head of the Special Prosecutor's Office against Impunity in the city of Quetzaltenango was spuriously convicted of the crime of 'ongoing abuse of authority' and sentenced to four years behind bars

in December 2022. The criminal proceedings against her began in 2018, after she reported a judge for possible inappropriate behaviour. In retaliation, that same judge filed two criminal complaints against her on the same grounds. Virginia was placed in pre-trial detention in February 2020, where she remained until her trial last year.

Amnesty is concerned that the authorities have condoned the use of vexatious litigation, forcing Virginia to defend herself simultaneously in two parallel proceedings initiated by the same person for the same acts. The authorities have also tolerated misogynistic attacks against her and her legal team.

# 126 people missing in Xinjiang China

#### ARBITRAILY DETAINED AMID GOVERNMENT CRACKDOWN



In the Xinjiang Uyghur Autonomous Region, 126 Uyghurs, Kazakhs and people from other predominantly Muslim ethnic groups are believed to be interned in camps or sentenced under vague and overly broad legal provisions without a fair trial and sent to prison.

They are among the estimated 1 million or more people in arbitrary detention in internment camps and

prisons in the region.

The Chinese government's crackdown against predominantly Muslim communities in Xinjiang is carried out under the guise of fighting terrorism.

In 2021, an Amnesty report showed that the systematic state-organised mass imprisonment, torture and persecution perpetrated by the authorities amounted to crimes against humanity. In August 2022, the UN Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights released a report finding that crimes against humanity may have occurred in Xinjiang.

#### **APPEAL**

Urge the president to immediately release everyone who is arbitrarily

detained in internment camps and prisons in Xinjiang. Pending their release, call on him to disclose their whereabouts without further delay, allow them access to their family and a lawyer of their choice, and ensure they are not subjected to torture or other ill-treatment.

#### Dr Mohammed al-Roken UAE

#### LAWYER KEPT IN PRISON DESPITE COMPLETING SENTENCE



Human rights lawyer and academic Dr Mohammed al-Roken (W4R 2014) is among eight Emirati dissidents who are still languishing

behind bars despite having completed their prison sentences.

In July 2013, Dr al-Roken was convicted of attempting to overthrow the government and given a 10-year sentence following a mass trial of activists and critics of the authorities. The politically motivated trial - known as 'UAE-94' - was part of a major

crackdown on human rights defenders designed to silence calls for reform. The proceedings were grossly unfair and marred by abuses, including defendants being denied access to a lawyer and held incommunicado or in solitary confinement. 'Confessions' obtained through torture were also used in court as evidence of their quilt.

Amnesty considers Dr al-Roken and the seven other dissidents to be prisoners of conscience.

# **FAMILY OF 'DISAPPEARED' JOURNALIST DENIED JUSTICE**



To mark the 17th anniversary of the enforced disappearance of the late journalist Ebrima Manneh, Amnesty has reiterated its call for his body to be released so

his family can finally bury him.
On 11 July 2006, Ebrima was arrested at the premises of pro-government newspaper the *Daily Observer* by

plainclothes officers believed to have been from the National Intelligence Agency. No official reason was provided by the authorities for his arrest.

In 2008, the Economic Community of West African States Court of Justice ordered the government to release Ebrima from unlawful detention and pay him compensation of \$100,000. This judgment was never complied with. In 2017, the police finally officially informed Ebrima family of his death, but provided no information about what happened or who was responsible. The family is unable to perform burial rites, as they still do not know where his body is.

#### > APPEAL

Urge the president to release the remains of Ebrima Manneh to his family so they can bury him. Also call for a thorough, impartial and transparent investigation into his death and to keep his family informed of its progress.

# ON TRIAL FOR PEACEFUL PROTEST



On 25 August 2018, police in Istanbul used tear gas and water cannons to disperse a peaceful gathering of mainly women, some of whom in their 80s, known as 'Saturday Mothers'. The women have been holding a peaceful vigil protesting the enforced disappearance of their relatives since the mid-1990s. Now the authorities have banned their vigil demanding justice for their loved ones and 46 people including relatives of the disappeared are on trial for their participation in the 700th vigil on 25 August 2018.

disappeared, and their supporters, to exercise their rights to freedom of expression and peaceful assembly, guaranteed in domestic and international human rights law.

# **Chow Hang-tung China**

# TARGETED FOR COMMEMORATING TIANANMEN SQUARE VICTIMS



Hong Kong human rights lawyer and labour rights advocate Chow Hang-tung (W4R 2022) has made it her mission to ensure the 1989 Tiananmen Square massacre victims are remembered, despite Chinese government attempts to make people forget about them.
After encouraging Hongkongers
on social media to light candles in
commemoration, Chow was arrested in
June 2021, convicted of 'advertising or
publicising unauthorised assembly' and
sentenced to 22 months behind bars.
At the time of her arrest, she was was
the vice-chair of the Hong Kong Alliance
in Support of Patriotic Democratic
Movements of China (the Alliance),
which had organised the annual
Hong Kong vigil commemorating the
Tiananmen crackdown since 1990.

In September 2021, Chow was also charged with 'inciting subversion' under the draconian National Security Law. If convicted, she faces a potential 10-year prison sentence, solely for peacefully exercising her freedom of expression.



# **GOVERNMENT FAILS TO BRING ACTIVIST'S KILLERS TO JUSTICE**



A leading human rights activist working in the North Caucasus region of Chechnya, Natalia Estemirova was abducted by armed men and killed on 15 July 2009. Fourteen years on, the Russian government has still not provided a full investigation into the murder and nobody has been brought to justice.

Natalia worked for the prominent Russian human rights NGO Memorial – which was forced to close in 2021 – and was well-known for investigating gross human rights violations committed by Russian state agents during the second 1999-2009 Chechen conflict. She repeatedly drew criticism and threats from the Chechen authorities, including the Kremlin-appointed Chechen leader Ramzan Kadyrov.

In August 2021, the European Court of Human Rights ruled that the Russian authorities had failed to properly investigate her murder.

# Vanyaneka and Ovaherero pastoralist communities Angola

# PASTORALISTS GO HUNGRY AS FERTILE LAND IS DIVERTED TO RANCHERS



The Angolan government's diversion of communal grazing land to commercial cattle farmers in the municipality of Gambos has eroded the economic,

social and cultural resilience of the local Vanyaneka and Ovaherero pastoralist groups (Real Lives, Spring 2020), most notably their food security.

The far tip of the southern province of Huila, Gambos is located in a semiarid region prone to cyclical droughts, but the communal grazing land of Tunda and Chimbolela has historically mitigated the impact of these dry spells among the pastoralist communities. Since the end of the civil war in 2002, however, the government has allowed ranchers to occupy 67 per cent of the fertile land in this area without due process. As a result, the Vanyaneka and Ovaherero now struggle to produce

food for themselves and the cattle on which they depend.

Urge the authorities to immediately deliver adequate food and drinking water to communities in Gambos who are suffering from or at risk of hunger and put in place long-term measures to increase the resilience of these communities to climate-driven crises.

# **Omar Radi Morocco/Western Sahara**

# **IMPRISONED AFTER UNFAIR TRIAL**



Omar Radi – a Moroccan journalist and vocal critic of the Moroccan government's human rights record –

was arrested on 29 July 2020. He was charged with 'harming national security' and rape. The Moroccan authorities have been harassing him since the publication in June 2020 of an Amnesty International report revealing they had unlawfully spied on him through his phone.

On 6 July 2021, Omar Radi was sentenced to six years in prison, after a grossly unfair trial. The court excluded some testimony in his defence and refused to call some defence witnesses. It also limited Omar's access to his lawyers and did not allow them to cross-examine witnesses.

In prison, Omar Radi is forbidden from writing and is denied the letters that friends and family send him.

Urge the authorities to quash the espionage charges against Omar Radi and grant a fair re-trial open to international observers for the rape charge. Ask that he be allowed to write and study.
