

"Chance2dance4charity was born. About twice a year, at the local village hall, anyone who wants to can just come and dance their hearts out for a joyful couple of hours. My dance teacher provides the music (with all my favourite songs, of course) and does a couple of short taster routines, e.g. cha cha cha, paso doble, jive, salsa etc to get everyone on their feet. Not that we need any encouragement to boogie on down! And we're all safely back home in our slippers in time for the 10 o'clock news.

"It's only £8 on the door (online with small booking fee) so very accessible and you can bring your own food/drink as there are no refreshments on sale. Which means no queues at the bar for overpriced drinks! All proceeds are split between Amnesty International and a different local charity each time. We raise about £80 - £100 for each charity at every event."
