World Day Against the Death Penalty

Helen and Liz presented Amnesty's Anti-death Penalty Project's campaign to "Adopt a US state", to write to their governor to join the many voices campaigning to an end to the DP. We spent some time considering our reasons for abolishing the death penalty - we quickly gathered a large number - see presentation.

Our group has chosen to adopt Ohio, as this was the state with the most planned execution dates at the moment. Liz has written a model letter to Governor DeWine, which members are encouraged to use.

There is significant evidence of corruption, with 10/11 exonerations showing issues within the prosecution process.

There is currently a pause on executions which seems like a good point to move on to a full abolition.

Liz will continue to bring key issues for this campaign to future meetings.

Blanca indicated she would like to work on Georgia, as she worked on the Troy Davies case in detail. Helen will also work on South Carolina.
