Join us, at a time of unprecedented attacks on free speech and freedom of assembly coinciding with over a year of genocide in Palestine, for a twenty second consecutive year in sending seasonal messages of solidarity to political prisoners in many parts of the world, as well as appeals to their captors. Last year we sent over 800 cards and letters, using case histories provided by Amnesty International. You will also be able to write to political prisoners in this country. We supply cards, pro-forma letters and envelopes, plus craft materials for younger campaigners. We will have our own Whalley Range cards available, courtesy of local photographers Ollie Morris and Joanne Cassidy. If you can afford to, please make a contribution to cover materials and postage.

Live entertainment will be provided by the Beech Band and Open Voice Choir. There will be food, savoury from Tibetan Kitchen, and sweet and hot and cold drinks available, and you will once again be able to enjoy mulled cider and/or Arabic tea! Shopping opportunities will include GM Friends of Palestine, Kimbilio, and News from Nowhere bookshop.
