Agree Campaign Focus for 2025

At January's meeting we had expressed an interest in a campaign around Women's rights, with a possible focus on Afghanistan and/or Iran.

Cherry Bird, AIUK's regional coordinator for South Asia has agreed to talk to us in March about Afghanistan which will be a very helpful background session for us.

It had been difficult to make contact with the relevant Amnesty team to discuss potential campaigns - however, we do have upcoming opportunities to talk online and at the Amnesty Feminists conference in March, so we can get advice then.

New member Adele spoke about her experiences as an asylum seeker

Adele first joined our group at the last meeting and offered to speak about her personal experience as an asylum seeker (AS) in the UK. Here's a summary of her talk

- Adele told us she was an international student from Saudi Arabia. As a younger person, Adele posted tweets criticising the Saudi Royal family. People are now being arrested for this kind of activism, so Adele cannot return home. Sadly Adele feels very unsafe as an asylum seeker here in the UK she has experienced bad advice, been targeted by fake human rights organisations, had her phone hacked, been threatened with being taken to mental health ward. She is very cautious of using the NHS. She has been very unwell (including covid twice) and now has difficulties with food that are not being catered for well at AS hostels. She feels she can't be herself and fears that she is being targeted by Saudi secret agents.
- Anne expressed deep sorrow for Adele on behalf of the group. As we are not a
 group who campaigns for individuals, we are not able to help Adele directly however, we hope that by being part of the group, she will find comfort and
 community.

Group campaign updates

• Cuba Just before President Biden stepped down, a deal was struck between Biden, the Vatican & the Cuban state. Cuba has announced gradual release of 553 prisoners, with definite news of 3 Prisoners of Conscience conditionally released in the last few days. This includes José Ferrer, who reportedly has been suffering beatings, isolation and health problems. However, there are two activists still incarcerated - Luis Manuel Otera Alcantara and Maykel Castillo Perez. So we hope to hear news of their release very soon.

- Rainbow Network (LGBT+) update Unite for Türkiye's Pride. Pride season is just
 around the corner all over the world. In Türkiye, LGBTI activists want to
 demonstrate again for unity and human rights, even though they are threatened by
 bans and police violence. <u>Sign this petition</u> and call on the Turkish Interior Minister
 to ensure this year's Pride is free from any threats, excessive use of force by the
 police, detention and prosecution.
- Hong Kong Helen updated about the group about the letter that was received regarding the petition we handed in to 10 Downing Street. the group felt it was a good reply - Helen will circulate to all the other groups who were involved in the petition. Helen has asked Nabila Hanson (AIUK's China coordinator) for her thoughts on next steps.
