KEEP CAMPSFIELD CLOSED

We have decided to join the Keep Campsfield Closed campaign. Campsfield is an immigration detention centre located in Kidlington near Oxford and has detained people for 25 years before it was closed in 2018. In 2022 the Conservative Government announced it would reopen the facility and this has been confirmed by the new Labour administration, although the camp remains closed at present. There have been a number of hunger strikes, fires, disturbances and two suicides during the running of the camp. The campaign is focused on keeping the camp closed and urging the Government to move towards community based alternatives which uphold values of humanity and justice.
